

## **April 2009 Ministry Project**

### Fruit Label Prayers

- Have each child bring 1-2 pieces of fruit. Ask that each piece of fruit have a fruit label attached.
- Using a world map, have each child remove the fruit label and place the label on the map where the fruit is grown.
- As a group, pray for the country, its government, the Christians and missionaries who live there to be bold witness for Christ, and for the people who do not know Christ to be ready and willing to receive Him.
- Repeat with each piece of fruit.
- Gather the fruit in a basket and deliver to a church member who could use a visit and good cheer.

This ministry project is an opportunity for children to pray for Christians, Non-Christians, and Missionaries around the world.

## **May 2009 Ministry Project**

### Flower Garden

- Contact the manager, director, or administrator of a local public institution or local business, such as the post office, school, nursing home, library, grocery store, etc., about planting flowers near the entrance.
- Have each child bring a container of flowers to plant.
- Bring gardening tools and supplies needed for planting the flowers.
- Have each child plant his/her flowers in the prepared soil.
- Include a small sign in the flower garden (herb/flower label stake can be purchased at a gardening center) that states, "God Loves You."

This ministry project allows children the opportunity to add beauty to people's lives and their community, and share the message of God's Love.

## **June 2009 Ministry Project**

### Playground or Park Ministry

1. Replace the label on water bottles with another paper label that states, "God Loves You!" Include a Bible verse and decorate.
2. Give bottles of water to families who are visiting a local park or playground.
3. Hand a water bottle to each person stating the words, "God Loves You."
4. Enjoy a few minutes of fun in the park/playground too, once all the water bottles are distributed.
